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1. Chair's foreword or executive summary

The Northern Rivers region continues to recover from the 2022 weather events, and in 2023/24, RDA Northern Rivers played a pivotal role in fostering positive outcomes across the region. Working in partnership with key government agencies such as AusIndustry, the NSW Reconstruction Authority, and Business NSW, RDA Northern Rivers has been instrumental in driving regionally significant initiatives.

One of the most notable achievements has been the successful uptake of users on the first phase of the Northern Rivers Rail Trail, which has seen remarkable success in its inaugural year. This success has garnered unanimous support from all Northern Rivers LGAs for the continued expansion of the Rail Trail. Construction is currently underway on additional sections, with plans for a completed trail agreed upon by all Councils. Securing government funding remains a priority for the completion of these works, and RDA Northern Rivers will continue to advocate and provide assistance where needed.

Additionally, RDA Northern Rivers experienced significant staffing changes this year, including the appointment of a new Director of Regional Development, who will continue to champion the region's priorities.

Throughout 2023/24, RDA Northern Rivers (RDA-NR) engaged successfully with a wide range of stakeholders and all levels of government, resulting in the creation and launch of two website platforms:

These platforms serve as valuable resources for prospective, current, and new residents, providing searchable information and supporting employers in their recruitment efforts, both within and outside the region.

Case Study 1

Case Study: Liveability Platform for Northern Rivers

A companion platform for Jobs Northern Rivers

As chair of the regional Work Force Development Steering Committee, Regional Development Australia (RDA) Northern Rivers, sought support for, and rolled out, the Jobs Northern Rivers platform – to support employers to promote their job vacancies to local job seekers.

At a time when unemployment had reached some record lows, a jobs platform for the region was not enough to support employers finding candidates. In recognition of the need to attract a workforce from beyond the region, a liveability platform was proposed as a companion to the jobs platform.

Specifically, the target audience groups to be reached by a liveability platform include:

- relocators researching infrastructure and lifestyle choices of the Northern Rivers,
- returning residents and
- intra-region relocators.

The objectives of the liveability platform are to provide information, for the above target audience groups, to showcase the region's:

- Economy
 - o Business/Employment Statistics,
 - o Key Industries,
 - o Connection to uWorkin Jobs Platform through widgets
 - Local Business Directory
 - o Business Events
- Lifestyle
 - o The LGAs
 - o Real Estate

Events aggregation platform to support engagement

A review of other regional liveability platforms was undertaken including Live Capricorn Coast, Canberra.com.au, Live Launceston and Live North Queensland.

Everi Pty Ltd was identified as a technology platform that:

- Delivers an automated events feed generating hundreds of events to keep visitors engaged;
- Provided an appealing, intuitive and professional user experience;
- Provided a ready module for business listings;
- Solid support and technical team with a strong development pathway for their product;
- Offered opportunity for ongoing functionality development and customization.

Funding & Support from Regional Stakeholders

- Branding design direction and collateral creation
- Media and stakeholder engagement

The platform – Live Northern Rivers – was made live on 31 July 2023.

Case Study 2

Case Study: Portal for Tender Opportunities in the Northern Rivers

Industry feedback driving a new initiative

In consultation with NSW Reconstruction Authority, Regional Development Australia (RDA) Northern Rivers, identified a need for local building and trades businesses to be able to see, at a glance a summary of tender opportunities in the region.

With seven local government areas and various NSW government departments providing tender opportunities, building and trades businesses were frustrated with the need to monitor tender opportunities across separate procurement and tender portals.

The collaboration with NSW Reconstruction Authority contained synergies with the funding of disaster recovery efforts. The anticipation in the industry is for a pipeline of projects that would require local building, construction and trades businesses to be alert to these opportunities that would come through councils, public works, main roads and other agencies.

Live Northern Rivers provides an opportunity


The Live Northern Rivers platform initiative is to showcase the lifestyle, work and business potential in our region. The need for an online summary of local tender opportunities fits in well with this objective. RDA Northern Rivers worked with the technology provider to design a feature that would integrate with the existing platform functionality. Leveraging the technology provider's expertise, a seamless solution was brought together that would:

- Aggregate tender opportunities relevant to the Northern Rivers;
- Deliver a friction-free solution to include council tenders without any effort on their part;
- Connects the summary direct to the source tender/procurement portal for businesses to get more information or submit an application;
- Provide businesses with a single page summary of the latest tender opportunities in:
 - Clarence Valley Council
 - o Richmond Valley Council
 - Lismore City Council
 - Kyogle Council
 - o Ballina Shire Council
 - o Byron Shire Council
 - o Tweed Shire Council
 - o Rous County Council
 - o Buy.NSW
 - Local Government Procurement (LGP.com)
- Allow users to register for a Weekly Email summarizing new tender opportunities
- Allow users to shortlist tenders they are interested in for alerts
- Allow users to create a custom alert for any tender opportunities that contain a keyword

- Communicate the new function to other regional agencies and chambers of commerce to promote awareness
